

#### Learner Centered. Volunteer Driven.

The mission of Literacy Volunteers of the New River Valley is to foster, support, advocate for, and instruct adults in the New River Valley who seek opportunities to achieve greater independence through literacy.



We are a community-based literacy program that provides free one-to-one or small group tutoring at a location and time that is convenient to both the learner and the tutor. We are a United Way Partner Agency and an affiliate member of ProLiteracy.



**Skill Up NRV** provides basic education services to adults who need literacy, language, and digital skills to increase employability, secure a new job, or retain employment to achieve economic self-sufficiency. Programs include GED preparation, financial and digital, and workforce readiness. Partnerships with Virginia Tech Student Affairs, Radford Library, Red Sun Farms, Montgomery County Drug Court, and other service organizations expanded our impact in 2021-22.

**Family Literacy** programs are provided in partnership with local public libraries to give parents the skills they need to read with their children and help them to be successful in school. A parent's reading skill is the greatest determinant of her child's academic success. Investing in education for parents doubles our impact, elevating literacy skills of adults and children at the same time.





Need for **English for Speakers of Other Languages and Citizenship Preparation** has grown in our area. By providing English conversation groups and classes, tutoring for the U.S. Citizenship exam, and one-on-one instruction, we provide the key to self-sufficiency and independence for immigrants and their families, resulting in a stronger, more vital community.

When individuals learn how to **read, write, do basic math, and use computers**, they have the power to lift themselves up, lower health care expenses, find and keep sustainable employment, and ultimately change their lives. Our adult learners work on goals such as studying for their driver's license, **preparing for their GED**, and so much more. They're changing their lives through literacy!



## 2021-22 HIGHLIGHTS



We served 197 English language learners and 46 basic literacy students during the year of 2021-22. Of these students, 102 were male and 141 were female; they resided in the counties of Floyd, Giles, Montgomery and Pulaski, as well as the city of Radford. The largest age group was 25-44.


